Day 1: Travel day

Board your overnight flight to Venice today.

Venice → 2 nights

Day 2: Arrival in Venice

Included meals: dinner

Welcome to Italy! Transfer to your hotel and get settled in. Later, meet your fellow travelers at tonight's welcome dinner.

Day 3: Sightseeing tour of Venice

Included meals: breakfast

Admire historic churches, winding canals, and picture-perfect piazzas on a guided tour of the city known as the Queen of the Adriatic.

- Step into the iconic St. Mark's Square and enter St. Mark's Basilica
- View the stately Doge's Palace, built in the Venetian Gothic style in 1340
- Marvel at the Bridge of Sighs, the link between Doge's Palace and the New Prison
- See a glassblowing demonstration to learn about the city's most celebrated art

Day 4: Transfer to Florence & sightseeing tour

Cross through the Apennine Mountains as you make your way to Florence. Once you arrive, get to know the city with a local guide.

- View the legendary Florence Cathedral, known as the Duomo
- Pass Giotto's Campanile, a masterpiece of Gothic architecture
- Walk past Piazza della Repubblica to the medieval Ponte Vecchio
- Stroll along the Arno River and through the courtyard of the Uffizi Gallery to Piazza della Signoria, center of Florentine life

Day 7: Rome via Assisi

Included meals: breakfast

Drive through spectacular Umbria to hillside Assisi, where you'll enjoy a guided tour of the town's UNESCO World Heritage sites.

- Visit Assisi's lower and upper basilicas
- See Giotto's magnificent frescoes and other late-medieval art

Then, continue on to Rome.

Day 8: Sightseeing tour of Rome

Included meals: breakfast

Follow in the footsteps of the ancient Romans on a guided tour of the Eternal City.

- Soak up over 2,000 years of history in Imperial Rome, viewing the Arch of Constantine and the Arch of Titus
- Enter the Colosseum, the largest amphitheater of the Roman Empire
- Stop at the ruins of the Forum, once the setting of parades, elections, and trials
- Pass by Palatine Hill to see Circus Maximus, the stadium where ancient Romans raced chariots, and the Baths of Caracalla

Day 9: Free day in Rome

Included meals: breakfast

Spend a free day to explore Rome or add an excursion.

Sorrento Peninsula → 3 nights

Day 10: Sorrento Peninsula via Montecassino & farmhouse dinner

Included meals: breakfast, dinner, wine tasting

En route to the Sorrento Peninsula, stop at Montecassino. You'll take a guided tour of the Abbey of Montecassino, which was completely destroyed during an American-led air raid and rebuilt after the war.

Later, take a short trip outside of Sorrento for a cultural experience at an agriturismo, or farm stay. Here you'll have a chance to explore the lush gardens, cultivated fields, and vegetation typical of many Mediterranean regions.

- After touring the farm, savor an aperitif of prosecco, meant to stimulate the appetite
- Indulge in a four-course dinner, complete with a wine tasting led by an experienced sommelier

Please note: Climbing stairs and walking is required in order to tour the farm.

Day 11: Free day on the Sorrento Peninsula

Included meals: breakfast

Spend a free day exploring the Sorrento Peninsula or add an excursion.

Day 12: Free day on the Sorrento Peninsula

Included meals: breakfast, farewell dinner

Enjoy one last free day exploring the Sorrento Peninsula on your own, or add an excursion.

Day 13: Departure

Sicily and explore this lovely locale with an expert guide in the lead.

Taormina Region → 3 nights

Day 13: Flight to Catania

Included meals: breakfast

Fly to Catania, Sicily. Then, transfer to the Taormina region.

Day 14: Sightseeing tour of Taormina

Included meals: breakfast

Meet up with a local guide who will introduce you to Taormina, a scenic town perched high above the sea.

- Enjoy views of Mount Etna, Taormina Cathedral, and Palazzo Corvaja, seat of the first Sicilian parliament
- Visit the town's 2nd-century Greek theater

Spend a free evening in the Taormina region or add an excursion.

+ Traditional Sicilian Dinner & Wine Tasting

Day 15: Hidden Sicily: Medieval Savoca & Forza d'Agrò

Included meals: breakfast

Delve into the traditional Sicilian villages that served as sets for Francis Ford Coppola's "The Godfather."

- Visit Savoca and tour the Church of St. Lucia and the Bar Vitelli.
- Walk through this medieval village and marvel at its 15th-century buildings and panoramic views of the Mediterranean sea.
- Continue on to Forza d'Agrò, another "hidden" Sicilian village, where you'll visit the Church of the Annunciation.

Please note: The order of villages visited is subject to change. In the event that the Church of the Annunciation is closed, it may only be viewed from the outside.

This evening, raise a glass and toast to your tip with a farewell drink.

More than 100 canals crisscross Venice, and boarding a sleek, black gondola to explore them has become a time-honored tradition. On this memorable excursion, join your fellow travelers for a tour through the canals of Venice, with a gondolier deftly guiding your boat along. Please note: This excursion runs as weather permits, and travelers should feel comfortable getting into and out of the gondolas. A private, two-person gondola ride is available for an additional cost.

Day 3: Private Gondola Ride: Canal Cruise for Two

Day 5: San Gimignano: Medieval Sights & Tuscan Flavors

Travel through the beautiful Tuscan countryside to discover the medieval village of San Gimignano. During the Renaissance, the rival Guelph and Ghibelline political factions flexed their muscles by constructing tall towers throughout San Gimignano; fourteen of those towers survive today. Later, visit a local winery for a taste of the area's wines and a sampling of olive oil and balsamic vinegar that you won't find anywhere else. Then, enjoy lasagna during a light lunch.

Day 6: Accademia Gallery

Home to Michelangelo's masterpiece David, the Accademia Gallery is one of the most famous museums in Florence. Skip the ticket lines, and join a local guide on a tour of the museum as you learn about Renaissance art history and view a variety of pieces, including the marble statue of David.

Day 8: Pasta-Making Class & Dinner

From \$119.00. Visit the link above for pricing info. (4 hours, departs in the evening, dinner included)

In this hands-on cooking class led by an experienced Italian chef, you'll learn to make pasta—perhaps pillow ravioli or castellane, a ridged shell pasta that's rolled into a long, oval shape—using traditional techniques you can keep on practicing when you get back home. Then, sit

down for dinner and enjoy the dishes you've prepared, along with wine.

Day 9: Iconic Sights: Vatican City

From \$125.00. Visit the link above for pricing info. (3.5 hours, departure time varies)

This guided tour takes you inside Vatican City—a UNESCO World Heritage Site and one of the most sacred places in Christendom. This independent city-state within Rome serves as the headquarters of the Roman Catholic Church and is home to the Pope. Upon arrival, turn on your pre-distributed headset and dive into the Vatican's rich history with your local guide. First, visit the Vatican Museums, which are more than 500 years old and house many of the world's most important Classical- and Renaissance-era sculptures. Next, step inside the Sistine Chapel, whose frescoed ceiling is arguably Michelangelo's greatest masterpiece. Finally, pay a visit to the enormous St. Peter's Basilica, the epicenter of the Roman Catholic faith. The artists who have contributed to its glory are some of the best Italy has ever known—Bramante, Peruzzi, Raphael, and Michelangelo. Masterpieces await at every turn, from Bernini's magnificent bronze canopy to Michelangelo's Madonna della Pietà.

Please note: Should this excursion fall on a Sunday, it'll be moved to another day of the tour. Backpacks aren't allowed in the Vatican, and shorts and sleeveless shirts are strictly prohibited. Due to closures of certain entrances and pathways, wait times may extend to several hours during busy travel months.

Day 11: Capri: A Day on the Iconic Island

Travel by ferry to the fabled isle of Capri, a beloved resort since the days of the Roman Republic. Weather permitting, you'll enjoy a boat ride around the island. Later, you'll enjoy free time to discover why everyone from Roman emperors to Sophia Loren has spent their vacations in Capri. If the weather prohibits a boat ride, you'll travel to the village of Anacapri, which offers stunning views of the surrounding scenery.

Please note: This excursion is weather-dependent. Travelers prone to seasickness should take the proper precautions.

Day 12: Scenic Amalfi Coast

Join a local guide and drive along the Amalfi Coast, enjoying views of lemon groves growing on terraced cliffs and whitewashed villas clinging to the rocky shores. Stop along the way at the Madonnina viewpoint. This scenic spot offers stunning views of the sea and overlooks Positano, one of the most famous towns on the Amalfi Coast. You'll also see the region's beauty up close during a visit to the town of Amalfi. Here, you'll admire picturesque streets and historic sites, including the architecturally stunning Cathedral of St. Andrew.

This unique, 13th-century cathedral houses relics of St. Andrew the Apostle, and you'll enjoy free time to step inside, do some shopping, or relax over a leisurely lunch. End your time in Amalfi with a taste of delizia al limone, a local lemon dessert.
